


ABOUT NEIGHBORHOODSTAT

REIMAGINING PUBLIC SAFETY BY FOSTERING CIVIC PARTICIPATION

NeighborhoodStat (Nstat) is a community-centered problem solving process grounded in the belief that public safety cannot exist without the public.

We believe that all neighborhoods are healthy, vibrant communities that have the expertise to set their own priorities and that the government should be supportive, responsive, and accountable to those priorities.



WHO WE ARE

NeighborhoodStat is an initiative of the Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Safety (ONS). The Neighborhood Safety Initiative (NSI) is ONS' primary implementation partner.

Since 2014, we work in partnership with neighborhood residents, city agencies, and community-based partners in 15 NYCHA neighborhoods that have faced historic disinvestment and, as a result, persistent crime.

In 2019, MAP and the Office to Prevent Gun Violence combined efforts under the Office of Neighborhood Safety (ONS), centering community expertise to strengthen safety, healing and well-being.

OUR PROJECTS

CENTRAL NEIGHBORHOODSTAT

Central NStat is the process we use to set our action agenda and priorities for policy change.

For 2021's Central NStat process, we hosted over 300 city-wide NYCHA residents and partners for a digital NeighborhoodStat Summit to learn how resident priorities can influence policy.

From February to May, we met with NYCHA residents and partners in working groups on health & well-being, safety & justice, economic stability, physical space, and youth development, which includes the Youth Leadership Council, to create a shared action agenda for public safety and well-being at ONS neighborhoods.



LOCAL NEIGHBORHOODSTAT

Local NeighborhoodStat is the participatory process we use to engage more residents in identifying priorities for their neighborhood.

This year, each NeighborhoodStat team selected five projects from the Action Agenda for a ballot that invited residents to decide how to spend \$30k on a project to improve safety & well-being. Each NeighborhoodStat team selected five projects from the Action Agenda for their ballot.

Local NeighborhoodStat was launched in each neighborhood with an engaging event that connected residents to their NStat team, the ballot and voting process, and a range of resources and opportunities.


PETITIONS ON DIRECT ACTIONS

Approximately 1500 residents signed petitions across our 15 LocalStat events that addressed issues in their local community. We will be following up with each site to complete the direct action.



ACTION PLANS

Once the voting process is complete, NStat teams start the design and approval process. NSI has designed a step-by-step toolkit that serves as a road map to guide the participatory design process. Engagement Coordinators facilitate these tools with resident teams to lead them through visioning and design to budgeting, vendor selection, and maintenance plans. Each action plan is specific to each site.



Project Votes By Age Group


